User profiles (characteristics of target participants for the research)

Recruitment plan

Stakeholder engagement

What methods will be used?

Choice and rationale for each research method

Questionnaires

Note-taking and question-asking guidelines for observers, including how to collaborate in effective data gathering without biasing the sessions

Facilitator script with questions for participants, including consent forms

Methods of data analysis and synthesis

Research ethics documents:

- Data management plan
- Privacy, confidentiality and anonymity
